

State of the Nation: Now

Our health systems face significant challenges.

Gaps in connected care continue to have negative impacts on clinicians and Canadians, impacting access, productivity and quality of care.







^{*}The gap can be a communication delay between healthcare providers, lack of important parts of the patient's health record by the HCPs, redoing diagnostic procedure (like a lab test or x-ray), time wasted because of ineffective communication between HCPs, repeating information to different HCPs.


State of the Nation: International Comparison

State of the Nation: Looking Ahead


Clinicians recognize the **benefits** of more connected care, responding that improved or increased interoperability would...

- Business model: Reimbursement-based sick care, fee for service


